



A Virtual Small Group Investment in Your Spiritual Growth Starts: Wednesday, October 7 @ 7:00 pm Ends: Wednesday, November 18

Perhaps the most challenging part of the COVID 19 season has been the loss of personal connection. While we have learned to virtually gather and connect via technology, we have all struggled with the disconnect from friends, family, and our spiritual community, the church.

In his book, *Life Together: A Discussion of Christian Fellowship*, Dietrich Bonhoeffer pondered how a church can deepen fellowship with Jesus and one another through the practice of the ancient ways of faith. Bonhoeffer is particularly interested in how a church grows deep community and mature disciples in a time of crisis. *Life Together* was written in 1938 and it is the reflections of Bonhoeffer on his time leading and building community in an underground seminary opposed to the Nazi movement in Germany from 1935-1937.

Starting on Wednesday, October 7, you can participate in a *Life Together* seven-week study on spiritual community. The study will conclude on Wednesday, November 18. Each group time will begin at 7:00 pm and conclude at 8:15. The meetings will take place on Zoom and include a large group seminar time and a small group time for conversation and prayer. If possible, we will substitute some in-person meeting time for Zoom connections.

Reading the book *Life Together* is part of the small group experience. You are welcome to read the book ahead of time, but there will be a reading plan that will take us through the seven weeks. Coupled with scriptural study, we will learn truths and practices of Christian community and discipleship.

A word of warning: *Life Together* is a small book, but Bonhoeffer is a challenging, provocative writer. So, be prepared! As part of our group times, we will cultivate understanding together!

Updates on Mission Circles and XYZ

Women's Mission Circles

The Alpha (Barbara Goff, leader) and Beta (Michele Pastor, leader) Circles normally meet monthly on the fourth and last Tuesdays at 1:00 pm and 2:00 pm respectively. The Delta Circle (Bev Parker, leader) normally meets on the second Monday at 7:00 pm. The circles meet either in member's homes or at the church. Each circle's members choose monthly mission projects. NOTE: Due to the pandemic, these groups have not met in person. However, projects have been ongoing.

<u>Change:</u> Michele Pastor resigned as Beta Circle leader, and Bev Parker took over the leadership of the circle.

The following is a list of mission projects:

March: All three circles were committed to preparing 175 personal care kits for the Romania team to take to Camp Hargita. Only one circle (Delta) met before meetings were paused and collected \$310 toward the kits. These funds remain in the church budget under the Romania line item in anticipation for future Romania needs.

April: All three circles donated funds for the Peninsula Rescue Mission for meals when Mary Ann Hutchinson, deacon, mentioned there was a need. A total of \$575 was collected, an FBC check was written from the Beta and Delta Circles and mailed to the Rescue Mission. Alpha sent their donation separately.

<u>July:</u> Delta Circle, of which Peggy White is a member, collected funds to donate to the Parkinson's Disease Association in memory of Stephen White.

<u>Current Project:</u> Delta has taken advantage of the school supply sales to collect them for future use. Mary Ann Hutchinson mentioned that the principal of Yates suggested waiting until January, however, this circle's annual project for August/September has been school supplies for Yates to be delivered in January for the last several years.

Additionally, email reminders of birthdays have been sent to Beta and Delta, as well as prayer needs within each of these groups, and others within the church. A special email "You Say, God Says" encouragement handout with Bible verses was sent to all three circles.

Once we are able to meet again in person, all ladies are welcome to visit and/or join any circle. It is not necessary to be an FBC member to participate in a circle. XYZ

The XYZ mission is to provide a venue for senior citizens to foster Christian fellowship. Luncheon/program meetings are held the third Friday of each month. Although this group has not been able to meet due to the pandemic, the following has been ongoing:

Telephone Contact: Group leaders, as they are able, have been in telephone contact with the members of their groups.

Other: Rube Brett, passed away on June 14th. Two XYZ members, Bev Parker and Peggy White, attended the memorial service at Albert Horton Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Suffolk on August 28th. Gale Burcher, XYZ group leader and Compassion Ministry member, along with other Compassion Ministry members, attended as well in support of Rube's wife Judith, also an XYZ member. Peggy White's son Stephen passed away July 6th.
