
The Post- Pandemic Road (part 2)

How many of you remember what you were doing last year on March 10, 2020? I was in the Outer Banks on a personal prayer and planning retreat. I had spent the first two days of the retreat working on sermon titles for the next year, my oldest son had driven down to spend a day with me, and I was looking forward to three remaining days of silence, reading, praying, and journaling. It was a time of spiritual replenishment I look forward to every year.

However, on Tuesday, March 10, I began to get phone calls from staff and lay leaders about the coronavirus. We had already decided the Sunday before I left to refrain from handshakes and to emphasize practicing handwashing and other basics of sound hygiene. Then, schools started talking about virtual learning. On Thursday, March 12, the NCAA did the unthinkable: they cancelled March Madness, which meant UVA would still be the national champions. For two days, I was having conversations back and forth until on that Thursday afternoon, I drove back early to Newport News. The next day, we held a meeting with the staff and vision team and after significant conversation and prayer. made the decision to suspend in person church activities and move to online worship. This decision occurred a couple of hours before the governor issued his stay home order for Virginia.

It is hard to believe a year has passed. We have learned to work from home, worship at home, and have our groceries delivered to home. As a church, we have developed a growing and creative online worship presence while also experiencing seasons of in person worship under COVID 19

Most children and teens in our area have lost the opportunity for in person school attendance, with all of the privileges and responsibilities that come with school. Teachers have missed seeing student faces as they learned to teach and engage students through virtual learning. Against all odds, teachers have taught, and students have learned. Against significant obstacles, our church has worshipped, served our community, and found ways to connect with one another over the phone, social media, email, letters, and cards and in some cases, creative in person connections. We have been lonely, and we have lost much, but, through the grace of God, we have kept moving forward.

In reflecting on this past year, I realize that so many people across our world have lost much more than me. In our church family, people have lost family members to COVID 19. Churches in our city are mourning the loss of members to COVID 19. Many in our city have lost jobs while others have lost months fighting off the effects and aftereffects of the coronavirus. As of this writing, our nation has counted over 525,000 COVID 19 deaths and nearly 30 million cases. It has been a long and challenging season.

Spring, however, is coming. Even in this time of Lent, we look toward resurrection. The hope of a post-pandemic world is moving toward us. Even now, God is making all things new (Revelation 21:5). Even now, thanks to the victory of our Lord Jesus Christ, we can, in the words of Eugene Peterson, "Practice Resurrection."

This new, post-pandemic world will look different from the old. In fact, the post-pandemic church will look different from the old as well. People have and will continue to return to in person worship gradually. A recent study from Lifeway resources noted that of the churches who participated, 31% were having less than 50% of the attendance they had in January of 2020 and another 37% of churches noted that they had less than 70% of their in-person worship attendance from
