Celebrating Nancy Thomas: 17 Years of Faithful Service

Nancy Staton Thomas retired from First Baptist Church of Newport News on March 1, 2020, right before public gatherings shut down due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The time has now come where we can safely celebrate the accomplishments and gifts of an extraordinary lady. This Saturday, from 2:00-4:00 pm in Payne Fellowship Hall, we will host a drop-in reception for Nancy. I hope you will join us. As a reminder, our COVID-19 protocols require unvaccinated persons to wear a mask in our building and masks are recommended for vaccinated persons as well.

Nancy has been a part of First Baptist all her life. In fact, she grew up living across the street from our downtown location. She spent many happy days in all areas of the church building! Nancy was baptized in 1954 and has served the Lord through her church family ever since.

She has taught Sunday School for 43 years to generations of preschool aged children. She has sung in the choir for 40 years, served on the Personnel, By-Laws, Lord's Supper and Decorating Committee, and even served as our church clerk for 10 years. Nancy has served our church in so many volunteer positions that it would take a number of paragraphs to catalog them all!

In 1990, however, Nancy offered to serve her church family in a new vein. She brought the skills she learned as a mother, Shipyard administrative assistant, and school administrative assistant to the church office. In addition to providing support to senior pastors, Nancy handled the multiplicity of tasks that occur in church offices ranging from phone calls, serving church and staff members, organizing volunteers and projects (and she is a stellar organizer), and in short, making sure the activity of the office always moved forward in serving the purposes of God. Nancy could handle a phone call, a visitor in the office, proofreading a bulletin, and a request from a staff member all at the same time and with a smile. She was the perfect blend of compassion and efficiency for a church office.

Nancy actually "retired" from the church staff once before - in 2001. However, in 2014, during a difficult interim season in the life of the church, Nancy returned to the church staff and brought her ability to organize and multitask to the church office. Her ability to connect and offer compassion to everyone she meets has made her an invaluable resource to the ministry team of our church. Nancy is missed in our office, but we are grateful to still see her regularly in retirement. We see her teaching Sunday School, singing in the choir, decorating, and doing whatever needs to be done, because Nancy loves her church.

Thank you, Nancy, for your years of service, and for your deep love for FBCNN and her history. You leave behind a legacy that will never be forgotten. For Nancy, her gifts, and her willing spirit, we offer our gratitude with a resounding, "Thanks be to God!"

Donation Opportunity for Those with IRA Required Minimum Distributions (RMD)

Congress has approved a permanent charitable giving tax break, known as the "IRA charitable rollover". The rollover is available for those who are 70 1/2, though if your 70th birthday is July 1, 2019 or later, you do not have to take withdrawals until you reach age 72. You can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA of up to \$100,000 to a charity, such as First Baptist Church. The donation will count toward your IRA required minimum distribution.

The distribution is not recognized as income on your tax return. As such, you do not take a donation deduction either. With the change in the recent Tax Legislation, the Standard Deduction has doubled thus itemized charitable deductions will no longer be needed to be kept track of. By donating all or part of your IRA RMD to the church, you receive the benefit of a reduced Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) in that the RMD to charity is not taxed, which helps the opportunity of obtaining lower cost for your Medicare Part B and Prescription Drug premiums.

The distribution must come directly from the IRA account to the church not through the owner of the account. Let our Financial Services Coordinator, Monica Garcia, know how you want the contribution designated, such as the General Fund.
