Women Pastors and the Current Conflict in the SBC

Many of you have asked me about the current issues in the Southern Baptist Convention regarding women pastors. Since these are significant events, I want you to be aware of them and how they impact our congregation. This Sunday, as part of our *Favorites* series, I will be preaching on Galatians 3:26-28, one of my favorite passages of scripture and one central to the conversation on who God calls. For now, let me share with you the following points of information.

First, our church partners with the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, Baptist General Association of Virginia, and the Southern Baptist Convention to engage in mission beyond our Peninsula: Our church budget sends mission monies through the church budget to the BGAV, the Lottie Moon and Annie Armstrong offerings of the SBC, the CBF Global Missions offering, and to CBF of Virginia. Personally, I have aligned myself solely with the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship ever since its founding in 1991, but, in good Baptist fashion, our church budget represents varying church member preferences regarding Baptist partnerships.

Second, the Southern Baptist Convention does not affirm the belief that women can serve as pastors. This is confirmed in Article VI of the *Baptist Faith and Message Statement 2000* which is one reason our church upholds the *Baptist Faith and Message 1963*. Furthermore, many, if not most, Southern Baptist Churches also do not affirm the belief that women can serve as deacons.

Third, in February, the SBC Executive Committee voted to deem five SBC churches "not in friendly cooperation" because they have women pastors.

Four of the churches have senior pastors that are women and one church, Saddleback Church, has a Teaching Pastor that is a woman. These five churches were dismissed as Executive Committee Chairman Jared Wellman said, "... [because] we remain committed to upholding the theological convictions of the SBC and maintaining unity among its cooperating churches." Fourth, Mike Law, an SBC pastor in Arlington, VA has been advocating for the SBC to add an amendment to the SBC Constitution that would prohibit churches with women pastors from being part of the SBC. To date, over 2,100 pastors, seminary professors, and SBC elders (all male) have signed the letter to the Executive Committee requesting the amendment.

Fifth, to support his call for an SBC constitutional amendment, Mike Law put together a web-based list of 170 women serving as pastors in the SBC. This list is found on Mike's website in the section entitled *Nashville, We Have a Problem*. He is suggesting the problem is women pastors. It is disturbing that a pastor thinks it's permissible and unifying to assemble a list of women pastors and churches, with their pictures, Google location of their churches, and in some cases, the names of family members. While all of this information may be public data, its compilation invites shaming, targeting, and heightened vulnerability for these women, churches,

and their families. As you may know, Lesley Spitzer, our Pastor of Worship and Creative Arts, was included in this list along with other churches and women pastors we know.

So, what does this mean for our church family? First, there is no guarantee that this amendment will actually come to the floor at the SBC meeting in June. However, the SBC has been clear since at least 1984 regarding its stand on women pastors. We must admit that the values of the SBC regarding women pastors are not consistent with the values of FBCNN. We call women to serve as pastors and deacons among us. As a church, you have done so long before I was your pastor. We must recognize the truth that the SBC disagrees with our stand on women pastors and deacons and that disagreement may lead them to treat us like the five churches mentioned in my third point above.

Second, the decision to call women pastors and deacons is not an ancillary issue of Biblical interpretation. The Bible is filled with stories of God calling whoever God chooses to call, women and men, to accomplish God's purposes. The truth is, God decides who God calls. God is not limited by our decisions or understanding. In effect, the decision to say that God does not call women to serve as pastors or deacons due to our understanding of scripture is akin to us telling God what God cannot do. God can call whoever God wants to accomplish God's mission.

Third, the decision to call women pastors and women deacons is a local church issue because Baptists are practitioners of local church autonomy. The people of FBCNN, under the leadership of Jesus Christ, determine the direction, staffing, spending, and partnerships of our church family. As Baptists, we partner with denominational groups for mission at our initiative and discretion. We are not supervised by a denominational entity. Therefore, our decisions are not dictated by any denominational group. We make our decisions prayerfully and strategically, under the direction of the Holy Spirit.

Finally, we have a lot of conversations happening in our church currently on these issues in leadership groups, deacon's meetings, Sunday morning Bible study classes, and small groups. This kind of healthy conversation is good and very Baptist! I want to offer some more chances for conversation and learning. So, on Wednesdays, April 26 and May 3 at 6:30 pm, I will lead a time of study on Women Pastors, Deacons, and Scripture. We will meet in the sanctuary due to the Citizens Police Academy meeting in Payne Hall. I hope you will join us for what I am sure will be scintillating conversations.
