# Juan Garcia Nominated as Moderator-Elect of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship

Pastor Juan Garcia of our Hispanic congregation has received a significant honor and responsibility in his recent nomination to serve as the Moderator-Elect of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship (CBF). Once he is formally approved at the CBF General Assembly in Atlanta, GA (June 28 – 30), Pastor Juan will serve a three-year term. The first year he will serve as Moderator-Elect, the next year he will serve as the Moderator, and in his final year, he will serve as the Immediate Past Moderator. This three-year role represents a significant respect for Juan's leadership abilities and a substantial investment from Juan in the life of CBF. Furthermore, CBF's nomination of Juan to this leadership role recognizes our church as a people deeply invested in missions, fully supportive of women in ministry, and completely embracing the Baptist freedoms that we have held dear for centuries including the priesthood of all believers, religious liberty, and local church autonomy.

What will this new role mean for Pastor Juan? The Moderator role is a volunteer role comparable to the presidency of the Baptist General Association of Virginia. As Moderator, Juan will chair the meetings of the CBF Governing Board and serve as the Moderator of the CBF General Assembly in 2025. He will serve as an encourager and adviser to CBF executive staff members. He will speak on behalf of CBF in an official capacity wherever he is needed. Juan's role at FBCNN will not change at all, but he will have new and exciting responsibilities to exercise on behalf of our church, CBF, and the kingdom of God.

I could not be prouder of Juan and I am excited for him as he takes on this new role. Over the past decade, our church has grown deeper in connection with CBF. We have sent one of our students to a CBF partner seminary, and we have called a graduate of a CBF partner seminary to serve as a full-time minister on our staff. We have hosted CBF field personnel (missionaries) in our services including Gennady and Mina Podgaisky (Kyiv, Ukraine), Matt and Michelle Norman (Barcelona, Spain), and Elket Rodriguez (US – Mexico border). At the recent Investing in Next Generations retreat, 8 people from our congregation went to Danville, VA to serve alongside and learn from Jessica Hearne, CBF field personnel in Danville. We hosted Mission Madness, a ministry of CBFVA, in March where 200 youth from around our state came together to serve and worship. We have given generously to CBF missions in Ukraine, Puerto Rico, and other places around the world. Pastor Juan has helped lead CBF Dawnings retreats, served on the CBF Governing Board, and been a founding participant and presence in the La Familia Network. Pastor Randy has led a monthly CBF Pastor Peer Group for the past 5 years and served a term as the Chair of the CBF Missions Council. Finally, this summer, one of our church members, Myles Shipp, will be commissioned as an endorsed chaplain at the CBF General Assembly and one of our college students, Samuel Shepley, will serve as a CBF Student.Go Intern at Hampton Baptist Church in Hampton, VA. Our relationship with CBF has grown and matured and in this season, I cannot think of a better person to serve as CBF Moderator-Elect than Juan Garcia. Thank you, Pastor Juan, for saying YES!

Please pray for Juan and his family as he takes on this new responsibility. Congratulate Juan on this remarkable leadership accomplishment. Finally, please pray for our church and CBF as we continue to do God's mission together.
