Letter from Kolby Keller

On the first Sunday of Advent, Pastor Randy started his sermon series the "Messiness of Christmas." He spoke of Joseph and the lesson his story teaches us about the messiness of the various seasons of our lives. This messy story of Christmas asks us to understand we may not always be prepared for the unexpected. Yet, in these moments, we need to have bold faith and a willingness to look towards God, which we can cultivate in the everyday practices of our lives. This same day, I spoke to the youth on the importance of finding peace in this messiness. During this crazy and joyful time of the year, we often forget to stop and reflect on the reason we celebrate this season. Many times, this overexertion of trying to do everything possible with a lack of pause tends to bleed into the rest of the year. We begin to create a pattern of running and constantly going. If we do not take the time to rest, as even God did, with time to "cease striving," then we may never hear Him. Instead, we should practice listening for God and His directives, preparing ourselves to step out completely in a bold faith when the unexpected happens. As God told Joseph to "run" from Herod in his stillness, He has told me to "rest."

After listening to God, my husband's concerns, my doctor, and conversations with Church staff, it has become necessary for the sustainability of my overall health and wellbeing to take a step back from ministry. These last two and a half years in which I have had phenomenal opportunity to grow in my love of God, my love of ministry, and the understanding of my calling has been delightful. It has been an even more amazing and life-changing piece that included being able to be a part of the youths' lives, seeing them grow spiritually and as people, and developing a lasting bond as a unit. Although my health has caused me to take a break from my calling, Johnny and I will continue to be members of this church and community, but I will focus on finding time to relax and restore. Like Joseph, I am listening to our Heavenly Father and what He is instructing me to do in this season, practicing being still and following Him. I will enter a new season of rest. I will continue to listen for God, waiting to hear when the season has come for my calling to ministry to resume. God truly put this season of being a Director of Youth Ministry into my life for many reasons, and I am forever grateful. I am so thankful to have served this body of believers and y'all's steadfast support. Thank you.

As you read in her beautifully written letter above, our Director of Youth Ministry, Kolby Keller, is stepping down at the end of December to focus on her health and self-care. Kolby has done tremendous work with our students during her two and a half years on our staff. She is a gifted leader who has invested herself in our teens and their families. I am even more proud of Kolby for choosing to follow the wisdom of her doctors, family, friends, and the Holy Spirit to care for herself than for the good work she has done among us. People are always more important than programs.

Take the time this month to send Kolby a card or email of encouragement. As for the future, our youth leaders, staff, and personnel committee are already thinking about next steps. We will look to hear from our teens and youth parents and we will share next steps with the church family as they emerge. For now, I invite you to join me in saying, "We love you, Kolby" with energy and gusto. We are grateful to God for Kolby's leadership, and we look forward to how she and Johnny continue to grow with us in the days ahead.


The US Fleet Forces Band will be performing a free Christmas concert here on December 10th. Be sure to invite your family and friends to this special event.
