What Does EMBRACE Mean?

Embrace. . . it is a word that has been a part of our church mission statement for years. Embracing God, Equipping Christ-followers, Engaging our world. This mission God has given us, it all begins with Embracing.

However, since my sabbatical last year, I have wrestled with and embraced (!) a formative truth: our life as a church family centers on embracing. We are called to Embrace God, Embrace one another, and Embrace our neighbor.

The word "embrace" can literally mean physically hugging or holding someone. While healthy, appropriate hugs (with permission!) are good for people, most people do not hug everyone. Hugs and holding are reserved for the most intimate relationships. What I mean by "our church family's life centers on embracing" is that we must extend the full open-armed welcome of God to all people. We must accept others in the same way God has accepted us. It is simple, really: God embraces us with God's love. Therefore, we embrace others with God's love.

Of course, it's not very simple at all. Excluding others is much easier than embracing them, particularly if we don't understand them. It is so easy to exclude and turn away from people who do or believe truths we do not like. It is so much easier to embrace the clarity of our beliefs than it is to embrace people. We live in a culture that readily labels, judges, and casts others aside. We excel at division. We champion exclusion.

At FBCNN, we have a different calling. In a world that prioritizes isolation and exclusion, we have the opportunity to embrace (!) a better way: the way of opened arm welcome. The way of love. The way of embrace.

Embrace is the hard, most excellent way. Have you ever tried to embrace and forgive someone who hurts you, who leaves you, who wounds you? This is part of what Jesus means when he tells us to love our enemies. The way of Embrace is the most challenging way. It is also the Jesus way.

Starting on October 6 with our Combined Sunday service, we will begin a new sermon series simply called, "Embrace." But friends, this is so much more than a sermon series. You will be invited to embrace a deep season of prayer. You will be invited to embrace a new way of living, being church, and following Jesus. Our church will be invited deeper into the mission of Embracing: to Embrace God, Embrace One Another, and Embrace Our Neighbors.

By the way, over the next few weeks, be on the lookout for persons who will ask you "What does embrace mean?" We can't wait to hear your answers! We can't wait to embrace (!) this season of EMBRACE!
